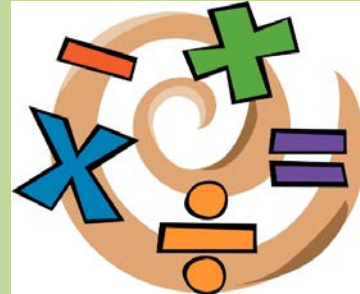
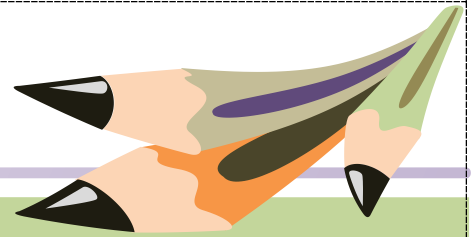
CHORUS

MATH & SCIENCE

Math 7: Students will continue studying Chapter 12, multistep equations and inequalities. Concepts will include solving equations with variables on each side, and solving inequalities. A quiz will be given on Friday, April 22, of solving two step equations.

Pre-algebra: Students will continue chapter 9, Real Numbers and Right Triangles. Concepts will include triangles, Pythagorean Theorem, and Distance and Midpoint Formula.

Algebra: Students will begin chapter 9, factoring. Concepts will include factoring trinomials, factoring differences of squares and perfect squares and factoring. Test for chapter 9 is tentatively scheduled for Thursday, April 28.

Life Science: Students will conclude chapter 18, Vertebrates and begin chapter 19, Birds and Mammals.
